

Check your National Insurance record online

If you can access your HMRC Personal Tax Account, you may be able to view your National Insurance (NI) record in a few minutes. A screenshot of the record can help us review your position much sooner.

Important

- This step is optional.
- Our team will now review the information you have provided to check whether you may be eligible for Home Responsibilities Protection (HRP). This review is usually completed within **7 days**.
- If we do not receive your NI record within **7 days**, we will request the NI information from HMRC using the authorization you have already signed.
- We will send you a second email once we have completed your HRP claim review.
- Evanshaw will never ask for your HMRC password. Only sign in on the official GOV.UK/HMRC pages.

What you may need

- An email address (and access to it)
- A mobile phone (HMRC may send a security code)
- Sometimes photo ID (HMRC will tell you if this is needed)

Step-by-step instructions

Step 1: Open the official NI record service

Open GOV.UK “Check your National Insurance record” and select Start now.

- Go to check your National Insurance Record on [GOV.UK](https://gov.uk)
- Tap or click “Start Now”.

- Use a Phone, tablet or computer

Check your National Insurance record

You can check your National Insurance record online to see:

- what you've paid, up to the start of the current tax year (6 April 2025)
- any [National Insurance credits](#) you've received
- if gaps in contributions or credits mean some years do not count towards your State Pension (they are not 'qualifying years')
- if you'll benefit from paying [voluntary contributions](#) to fill any gaps
- how your State Pension forecast will change if you decide to pay voluntary contributions
- if you can pay voluntary contributions online and how much this will cost

Step 3: Enter the security code

HMRC may send a security code to your phone or email. Enter it to continue.

- HMRC will usually send a security code to your phone or email.
- Enter the code on screen to continue
- Do not share your password with anyone.

- You will see a list of tax years and whether each year counts
- Scroll down to see older years

Step 5: Save it (screenshots or PDF)

Take clear screenshots as you scroll (phone/tablet) or use Print → Save as PDF (computer).

- Take clear screenshots showing the list of years
- If you are on computer, you can also print and “Save as PDF”
- Please include the years around 1978-2020 if possible

What Happens Next

- If you send your NI record: we can usually start checking your NI/HRP position much sooner.
- If you do nothing: that is fine. If we do not receive anything within 7 days, we will request the NI information from HMRC under your signed authorisation.

If you have trouble signing in

HMRC provides help if you cannot sign in to your account. If you cannot access the online service, you can ignore this step and we will request the NI information from HMRC after 7 days.

Keeping your information safe

- Evanshaw will never ask for your HMRC password.
- Only sign in through the official GOV.UK/HMRC pages.
- If you email screenshots, include only what is necessary for us to match your record (name and date of birth).
